PHLEBOTOMY TECHNICIAN PROGRAM:

A Phlebotomy Technician is a key member of the medical laboratory team whose primary function is the collection of blood samples from patients by venipuncture or microtechniques.” –American Medical Technologists

CTI's Phlebotomy Technician program has obtained program approval from:

- ▶ **Ventura County Medical Association**
- ▶ **State of California's Laboratory Field Services**
- ▶ **American Medical Technologists (AMT)**
- ▶ **Bureau of Private Postsecondary Education**

CTI's Phlebotomy Technician Program is structured in a learning-effective 50% theory / 50% hands-on method. Upon successful completion of CTI's Phlebotomy Program, students will:

- ▶ Be familiar with commonly used medical terminology related to phlebotomy
- ▶ Understand the anatomy and physiology of the circulatory system
- ▶ Be aware of the legal issues related to blood collection procedures & patient care.
- ▶ Be familiar with blood collection equipment and procedures
- ▶ Successfully obtain blood through various blood collection procedures
- ▶ Understand the procedure for arterial blood collection
- ▶ Be familiar with complications and procedural errors
- ▶ Know about infection control, safety and first aid

All Phlebotomists must be CERTIFIED through the Department of Health Services, Laboratory Field Services Division in order to maintain employment as a Phlebotomist.

(Effective April 9, 2003, all persons performing phlebotomy who are not doctors, nurses, or clinical lab scientists, must be certified as a phlebotomist before they can draw blood.)

STATE CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- ▶ Attend a phlebotomy training program that has been approved by the State's Laboratory Field Services Department.
- ▶ Complete a minimum of 40 hours of clinical training at a State-Approved lab. (CTI requires 64 Hours didactic training, 40 Hours clinical training at a State-Approved Lab, 50 venipunctures, 10 skin punctures)*
- ▶ Pass a written certification exam from an organization approved by the California Department of Health Services.
- ▶ State Application Fee \$100

Once you have passed the National certification exam, you must submit the following to the State for certification:

- ▶ High School Transcript or GED
- ▶ CTI Certificate
- ▶ AMT Test Results (\$120 Testing Fee)

**Proof of Clinical Hours Completed(California statute requires that students successfully completing a course of study be awarded the appropriate diploma or certificate. Graduates of CTI courses are awarded a certificate of completion upon successful completion of the program.*

PHARMACY TECHNICIAN PROGRAM:

What Pharmacy Technicians Do: Pharmacy technicians help licensed pharmacists dispense prescription medication to customers or health professionals.

Work Environment: Pharmacy technicians work in pharmacies, including those found in grocery and drug stores, and in hospitals. Most work full time, but many work part time.

Job Outlook: Employment of pharmacy technicians is projected to grow 20 percent from 2012 to 2022, faster than the average for all occupations. Several factors will lead to increased demand for prescription medications.

- ▶ Pharmacy calculations
- ▶ terminology specific to the pharmacy
- ▶ Skills to read and interpret prescriptions
- ▶ Review of the top 200 drugs
- ▶ Skills to identify drugs by generic and brand names
- ▶ Dosage calculations, I.V. flow rates, drug compounding, and dose conversions
- ▶ Dispensing of prescriptions, inventory control, and billing and reimbursement
- ▶ Education and Certifications

Students should have or be pursuing a high school diploma or GED. The Pharmacy Technician Certification Board's (PTCB) is the national certification exam.
